Tietgen Business College Foundation Jubilee Scholarship

The Tietgen Business College Foundation Jubilee Scholarship has been constituted by combining three grants: the Tietgen Business College Jubilee Scholarship (established in connection with the 25th anniversary of Tietgen Business College in 1979), the N. Petersen Trælastforretnings og Frederiksbrosens Kalkværks Mindelegat (N. Petersen Timber and Frederiksbrosen Limeworks Memorial Scholarship) and the Haandværkersparekassens Jubilæumslegat (the Trade Bank Jubilee Scholarship).

The aim of the Foundation is to provide opportunities for young Danes, chiefly present students at Tietgen Business College, to travel abroad or to pursue further education at other educational institutions in Denmark or at recognized schools abroad.

The trustees hereby invite applications for spring 2009.

Closing date for applications: 1 March 2009.

Each scholarship will primarily cover travel expenses to and from the recipient's destination as well as expenses connected to the studies.

Applications should include relevant information regarding the applicant's present course of education, information regarding the planned course of study and a budget.

Announcement of the award will be made in late March 2009. The scholarship will be authorized for payment upon verification for the course of study or acceptance at an educational institution.

Call for applications for scholarships in the spring term 2009.

Closing date for applications is 1 March 2009.

Announcement of any awards will be made in late March 2009.

The objectives are primarily study activities, traineeships, exchange programs, etc. abroad.
The scholarships will be distributed according to the following principles:

1. Extended periods of study (DKK 10,000 – 15,000)
2. Short periods of study of less than six months (approx. DKK 5,000)
3. Traineeships, paper writing, etc. (approx. 3,000)
4. Class applications for exchange programs, etc.
